## 2. Important information

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### 2.1 For your safety

To prevent severe injury and loss of life/property, this section carefully before using the product to ensure proper and safe operation of your product.



Preventing fire and electric shock

- Use only the power source marked on the product. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult your dealer or local power company.
- Use only the specified power supply unit.
- Do not attempt to disassemble or modify this product. Contact an authorised service centre for repairs.
- Never touch the power supply unit with wet hand.
- Do not use the product (excluding the doorphone) in areas that are exposed to rain, moisture, steam, or oily smoke, or areas that have excessive dust.
- Do not perform any actions (such as fabricating, twisting, stretching, bundling, forcibly bending, damaging, altering, exposing to heat sources, or placing heavy objects on the power cable) that may damage the power cable. Using the product with a damaged power cable may cause electric shock, short circuits, or fire. Contact an authorised service centre for repairs.

Environment

- Keep the unit away from electrical noise generating devices, such as fluorescent lamps and motors.
- The unit should not be exposed to direct sunlight.

- The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators, cookers, etc. It should not be placed in rooms where the temperature is less than -20°C or greater than 40°C (For indoor) & 70°C (For outdoor). Damp basements should also be avoided.





### Operation Instruction

#### VISITOR CALL

The Visitor press the **call** button on Door station 1 

▼ A ringtone is heard inside and outside

The visitor's image automatically displayed on the screen

Press the **talk** button on Monitor station 

▼ Stop ringing

Start conversation with Door station

▼ The conversation duration is 120s max at a time

Press the **unlock** button on Monitor station to release the door lock 

The Visitor press the **call** button on Door station 2 

#### NOTICE:

If both the call buttons on two door stations are pressed approximately at the same time, the preference will be given to the door station on which call button was pressed first, unless the call button is pressed again after the monitor station goes into standby mode. Please note that there will be no indication on second door station.

Press the hang up button on Monitor station 

End

The monitor station will automatically go into standby mode after 60s, If unattended.


**In video mode:** It will start recording when the call button is pressed.

**In snapshot mode:** It will take a picture when the call button is pressed. Press the side button " " or front button " " again to take another picture.

## Monitoring Mode

Option in the settings in the menu: DOOR1, CAM1, DOOR2, CAM2 operating mode (open or closed)

### Standby mode



### NOTICE:

If you are using only one outdoor camera in monitoring mode, you can also end the monitoring mode by pressing the monitoring button again (Must close CAM1, DOOR2 and CAM2 in the menu option).

- i** If you use two indoor units, you can also simultaneously start monitoring mode on other indoor unit, the same images are displayed on the screen of the different indoor unit.
- i** If a conversation with outdoor unit is underway in monitoring mode, during this time a visitor presses the call button on either of outdoor unit, the monitoring mode will be switched off, the just visitor's image will be shown, and continuous ringing will be heard. If you are using the indoor unit, you can press the talking button to reactivate conversation with the visitor.
- i** In standby mode, when pressing "▶" button, the monitor will go to video file list or snapshot file list unread directly. If no videos or snapshots are unread, pressing this button will go to playback menu.
- i** In monitoring or talk mode, press "▶" to perform manual snapshot, press side button "▲" or "▼" to increase or decrease talking volume.

## 5.Menu Operations

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### Standby Mode

In standby page, date and time, unread recorded files and SD card status will be shown here.





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### Menu Operations



In standby mode, press the button "" once to enter the main menu settings. In main menu settings, press the cursor button "" upward, or "" downward to select sub-menu, then press "" again to enter sub-menu. In sub-menu settings, press "" or "" to select menu then press "" to confirm. Select option "Return" on main menu, then press the button "" to exit menu/sub menu interface, or you can press "" button to return quickly, and the monitor will turn into standby mode.




If the system is unattended for 60s, it will automatically return to standby mode. In standby mode, press the button “

## 5.Menu Operations

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### 1.2 System Time



Press the cursor button “▲” or “▼” to select and adjust the date and time, then press “☰” to confirm.

### 1.3 System Information

On system menu, move the cursor to “Information” and press “☰” to enter the “Information” menu. The information includes software version and release date.



[Format SD] : Format SD card, please format SD card first before using.

Note: The product only supports Micro SD cards higher than Class10.

[Factory reset] : To restore factory setting.

[Backup pictures] : Back up pictures stored in built-in memory to SD card, otherwise these pictures can't be seen if SD card is inserted.

[Update] : For the models supporting Micro SD card, users can upgrade the firmware of the device via Micro SD card.

Note: During the system upgrading, don't remove the SD card or power off the device. After completing the upgrade, the device will restart.

[Reboot] : press “☰” It will pop-up a window, choose "Yes" to restart the machine, choose "NO" to cancel.

[Return] : Exit the current menu.

## 2. Ringtone Setting

On main menu, move the cursor to the option “Ring”, then press “” to enter the “Ring” menu. Ring setup includes: “Ring select” and “Ring volume”.



### 2.1 Ring Select

On ring menu, move the cursor to “Ring select” and press “” to enter the “Ring” menu



On ring menu, move the cursor to “Ring Select” and enter the option by pressing “” then you can select and set the doorbell ring tone for door station 1 and door station 2, there are 12 different ringtones.

[Door1] : To set up the doorbell tone of the outdoor camera 1, total 12 ringtones.

[Door2] : To set up the doorbell tone of the outdoor camera 2, total 12 ringtones.

[Return] : Exit the current menu.

### 2.2 Ring Volume

On ring menu, move the cursor to “Ring volume” and press “” to enter the “Ring volume” menu to set up the ring volume. Users can set up different ring volume during three different time period, the ring volume and ring time can be adjusted from 15s to 60s when calling.


## 5.Menu Operations

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**[Schedule 1]:** You can select the time period (as below), and then set the volume (range: 01-10) and Ring Time(range: 15-60s). The factory default setting for the volume is 08 and Ring Time is 30s.

**[Schedule 2]:** You can select the time period (as below), and then set the volume (range: 01-10) and Ring Time(range: 15-60s). The factory default setting for the volume is 08 and Ring Time is 30s.

**[Schedule 3]:** You can select the time period (as below), and then set the volume (range: 01-10) and Ring Time(range: 15-60s). The factory default setting for the volume is 08 and Ring Time is 30s.



## 3. Mode Setting

You can set the mode for the monitor and unlock time and record mode.

[Mode]: Options include "Master" and "Slave". When you need connect multiple monitor, "Master" indicates that the main monitor connects the outdoor unit and cameras, "Slave" indicates that the extension monitor connects the main monitor and extension monitor.

Note: Extension monitor is also known as Slave monitor.

[Door2 status]: Enable or disable the preview of Door2.

[Door1 Unlock Time]: To control the unlocking time for the electric lock on door station 1.

[Door2 Unlock Time]: To control the unlocking time for the electric lock on door station 2.

[Record mode]: Options include "Video" and "Snapshot". "Video" indicates that the device with SD card will start record automatically when a visitor press the call button on the outdoor camera. "Snapshot" indicates that the device with SD card or built-in storage will capture a frame of the video stream as a still photo if a visitor press the call button on the outdoor camera.

[Return]: Exit the current menu.

## 4. Security Alarm Setting

On main menu, move the cursor to the option “Alarm”, then press “” to enter the “Alarm” menu.



[CAM 1 Sensor Type]: Enable or disable (ON/OFF) sensor 1. If disabled, sensor 1 will not trigger alarm.

[CAM 2 Sensor Type]: Enable or disable (ON/OFF) sensor 2. If disabled, sensor 2 will not trigger alarm.

[CAM1]: Enable or disable (ON/OFF) camera 1. If disabled, you cannot monitor camera 1.

[CAM2]: Enable or disable (ON/OFF) camera 2. If disabled, you cannot monitor camera 2.

[Cam1/Sensor1 ring time]: The alarm ring time of camera 1 if camera 1 has been triggered by activity detected by the sensor, values can be set from 0-30 seconds.

[CAM2/Sensor2 ring time]: The alarm ring time of camera 2 if camera 2 has been triggered by activity detected by the sensor, values can be set from 0~30 seconds.

[Alarm record]: Options include “Video” and “Snapshot”. “Video” indicates that when a sensor alarm is triggered, it will activate the corresponding channel to start recording a video for 30s.

“Snapshot” indicates that when a sensor alarm is triggered, it will activate the corresponding channel to capture a picture of the current video stream

[Return]: Exit the current menu.

## 5. Set Color Parameters


On main menu, move the cursor to the option “Color”, then press “” to enter the “color” menu.



## 5.Menu Operations

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On the color menu the video color of Door1/Door2/CAM1/CAM2 attributes can be adjusted. Scroll the button “▲” or “▼” to move the cursor to the option “Door1” or “Door2” or “CAM1” or “CAM2” , then press “☰” to enter the corresponding menu to adjust values of brightness, contrast and chrome depending on the actual conditions.



[Return] : Exit the current menu.


## 6. Files

On main menu, move the cursor to the option “Files”, then press button “☰” to enter the “Files” menu. Options include “Video files” and “Snapshot files”



### 6.1 Video Files

On “Files” menu scroll the button “▲” or “▼” to move the cursor to the option “Video Files”, press the button “☰” to enter the video files list. Scroll the button “▲” or “▼” to move the cursor to select file to playback, a red list indicates that the list has been selected, press the button “☰” to choose to playback, delete current file or delete all files. During playback scroll the button “▲” or “▼” it will switch the current video to the last file or the next file, and press the button “☰” again to exit. Move the cursor to the option "Return" and press “☰” to exit the current menu.



## 6.2 Snapshot Files

On "Files" menu scroll the button "▲" or "▼" to move the cursor to the option "snapshot Files", press the button "☰" to enter snapshot files list. Scroll the button "▲" or "▼" to move the cursor to select file to playback, a red list indicates that the list has been selected, press the button "☰" to choose to playback, delete current file or delete all files. During playback scroll the button "▲" or "▼" it will switch the current snapshot to the last file or the next file, and press the button "☰" again to exit. Move the cursor to the option "Return" and press "☰" to exit the current.



## 6.Alarm instructions

### Alarm Instructions

CAM1 and CAM2 port of the monitor can connect alarm sensor. When the alarm terminal and GND is shorted, the alarm is activated, the speaker of the indoor unit will ring 0-30s according to the setting. During this time, click "OFF" to stop alarming and enter the standby mode. Once the alarm is triggered, the system will start recording or taking snapshots (depending on the system settings). The video recording time is 15s, during this time, click "OFF" to stop the alarm and enter the standby mode.

#### Connection Diagram:

2 Camera channels (CAM1 & CAM2) of alarm input without limitations input type, either the NO (normally open) or the NC (normally closed) are available.


The Output terminal of the alarm detector should be connected to the Alarm Input terminal on the back panel of monitor. The terminal +12V can be used as power supply for Camera and Alarm. Or the external power adaptor is available.

(Note: The current rating is 150mA.)

For NO alarm inputs, when the GND and ALM are in the connection state, it will trigger the alarm.  
For NC alarm inputs, when the GND and ALM are in the disconnect state, it will trigger the alarm.
